Subject: White Food Sack

On September 11, 1996, a Department of Public Safety Lab Report was forwarded to Texas Ranger Salvator Abreo, concerning the 5" X 10" white in color paper sack. This report was generated from Kenneth Crawford, a criminalist with the Forensic Document Section. In his analysis, Crawford determined the sack was manufactured in Grand Prairie, Texas, at the Willamette plant (214) 641-2971. The code imprinted on the sack indicates that this item was manufactured on May 16, 1996 by the "graveyard shift."

On July 16, 1997, I went to the Town and Country convenient store, located at 700 E Waylon Jennings, in Littlefield, Texas. They do not carry white in color food sacks. I then proceeded to the Town and country convenient store located at 2500 Hall Avenue. This store did not carry white in color food sacks. The only store in Littlefield to carry and distribute this type of sack is the Jolly Roger Convenient store.

On August 15, 1997, I made contact with Emily Pickard, the Jolly Roger's Convenient store manager. She informed me that they purchase this brand of sack in question from the Affiliated Warehouse in Amarillo, Texas (800) 234-3661.

I made contact with Danny Peters of Affiliated Warehouse. He informed me that they did distribute this brand of sack from Willamete to the Jolly Roger in Littlefield, Texas. No other stores in Littlefield receive this type of bag from Affiliated Warehouse. Peters advised it would not be possible to track this particular sack by the date of manufacture information, due to the fact that these stats are not recorded and have nothing to do with their sale and distribution.
